A Message from the Health Office

Please stop by the health office to pick up medication(s) that have been stored here during the school year. Medications *cannot* be sent home with your student. This policy is important to safeguard all students against improper or accidental ingestion of medication.

All medications & health office supplies need to be picked up before 11:00 am on Friday May 26th This is the last day of school and it is a half day. Due to the volume of medications in the health office and the process to sign meds out, please come any time before May 26th to pick up medications. If medications are picked up before the last day of school, the needed number of pills can be counted out and kept in the original container at school.

The school nurse will follow state health department procedures and medications will be properly disposed of. This includes ALL medications (Rx, epinephrine injectors, inhalers, diabetic supplies, etc.) not picked up before 11:00 am on the last day of **school.** Medications cannot be saved in the health office over summer break. Thank you for understanding.

If medications are needed for the **2023-2024** school year, you may obtain new forms from the PSD website over the summer. New forms are needed every school year and do not carry over. You can click here for new forms: https://www.psdschools.org/programs-services/student-health





To: Parents/guardians of students enrolled in Colorado schools

Re: Tdap vaccine required for sixth-grade entry

Dear Parent/Guardian, (health care providers, please see reverse side).

Colorado law <u>requires</u> students who are entering sixth grade to receive a tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis (Tdap) vaccine <u>before</u> their first day of school.

The Tdap vaccine can prevent tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis. Tetanus enters the body through cuts or wounds and cannot be spread from person to person. Diphtheria and pertussis spread from person to person.

- **Tetanus** causes painful stiffening of the muscles. Tetanus can lead to serious health problems, including the inability to open your mouth, difficulty swallowing and breathing, and death.
- **Diphtheria** can lead to difficulty breathing, heart failure, paralysis, and death.
- **Pertussis**, also known as "whooping cough," can cause uncontrollable, violent coughing that makes it hard to breathe, eat, or drink. Pertussis can be extremely serious, especially in infants and young children, and can cause pneumonia, convulsions, brain damage, or death. In teens and adults, it can cause weight loss, loss of bladder control, passing out, and rib fractures from severe coughing.

While the Tdap vaccine is typically given at age 11 for students who are entering sixth grade, it may also be given as early as 10 years of age. When it is given at age 10, it will: 1) Count as a valid adolescent Tdap dose, and 2) meet Colorado's sixth grade Tdap school vaccine requirement.

Is your sixth-grader missing their Tdap vaccine? Click <u>here</u> to find an immunization provider near you.

If your child does not receive Tdap vaccine at sixth-grade entry, regardless of their age, a certificate of <u>medical</u> or <u>nonmedical</u> exemption must be submitted to the school. This will ensure your student is compliant with Colorado school immunization law and able to attend school.

Re: Tdap vaccine required for sixth-grade entry

Dear health care provider, (parents and guardians, please see reverse side).

Colorado law <u>requires</u> students who are 10 or 11 years of age and entering sixth grade to receive a Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis) vaccine <u>before</u> the start of the school year.

The <u>Colorado Board of Health Rule</u> aligns with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) <u>immunization schedule</u>. While Tdap vaccine is typically given at age 11 for students entering sixth grade, it may also be given at 10 years of age. This is <u>allowed by CDC</u>. A Tdap dose given at age 10 will count as a valid adolescent Tdap dose and meet Colorado's sixth grade Tdap school vaccine requirement.

Per Colorado law, prior to school entry, the student's parent/guardian is responsible for submitting a student's school-required vaccine records. If these are not submitted to the school, the student's parent/guardian is responsible for submitting a Certificate of <u>Medical</u> or <u>Nonmedical</u> Exemption in order for their student to attend school. *Refer to this* <u>CDC web page</u> for definitions of medical contraindications to vaccines.

Immunizations are the best protection against vaccine-preventable diseases. Access the following resources to support children and adolescents in staying current or catching up with their routine vaccines, including Tdap and DTaP.

Routinely timed vaccines:

• Child and adolescent immunization schedule (CDC)
